Sexual Health services

Our team provide free testing, treatment, management and counselling for sexually transmissible infections, HIV and hepatitis. We also offer free sexual health services for:

- · men who have sex with other men
- people living with HIV
- sex workers
- Aboriginal people
- pregnant people
- people diagnosed with a sexually transmitted infection
- people who inject drugs
- trans and gender-diverse people
- people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

We also provide the following services:

- PrEP for patients who do not have Medicare
- contraception
- pregnancy testing and counselling
- condoms and lubricant
- needle and syringe programs and sexual health check-ups for people who inject drugs
- Post Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) for HIV
- vaccinations (relevant to sexual health)

Your first visit to the clinic

We will complete your registration and a brief health history over the phone or when you visit the clinic for your first appointment. The information you provide will remain confidential and stored in a numbered electronic file. When you call to book, a nurse will determine whether you need to see a doctor or nurse for a medical issue or a counsellor to discuss information on sexual health, safer sex or relationship issues.

Frequently asked questions

Do I need an appointment to attend the clinic?

Yes, it is preferable for you to book an appointment before attending the clinic.

Do I need a Medicare card to attend the clinic?

No, you do not need a Medicare card to attend the clinic.

Do I have to pay for services?

No, there is no cost to you for the clinic's services.

Do I need a referral from a doctor to attend the clinic?

No, you do not need a doctor or GP referral to attend the

Can I get an interpreter for my appointment?

Yes, our friendly staff will arrange an interpreter for you. Please inform staff if you need an interpreter when you call to make an appointment.

Getting to the clinic

The RPA Sexual Health clinic is accessible by bus, train, walking, cycling, taxi and private vehicles.

Taxi

 A taxi rank is located on Missenden Road towards Parramatta Road, a short walk from the clinic.

Public parking

• Limited public parking is available on Hospital Road, off Carillon Avenue, for \$5 per hour. The car park is open 24/7 but with restricted lift and ramp access.

Public transport

- Newtown Station (T2 services) is located on King St, a 15-minute walk from the clinic, or available on bus routes M30, 352, 370, 422, 423, L23, 426, 428 or L28. The station is wheelchair accessible.
- The closest bus stop is located at the corner of Parramatta Road and Missenden Road, a twominute walk from the clinic. Bus routes L38, L39, 436, 438, 439 and 440 depart from Circular Quay, Town Hall and Railway Square (Central). Additional buses travelling from Railway Square (Central) include M10 and 412, alighting outside the RPA Hospital main building on Missenden Road).
- Another bus stop is located at the King Street end of Missenden Road, a 10-minute walk from the clinic, for users of bus routes 422, 423, 426, and 428. The 412 and 422 stops in front of the Rydges Hotel on Missenden Rd.


